

Staffing

- The 1 pupil in the whole school with 1 or more suspensions in 2021/22 was suspended on 2 or more occasions but fewer than 10.
- Of the 2 suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, both were for physical assault against a pupil.
- There were no permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous two years either.
