<u>Animals including humans</u> • Make a collection of animals and sort them according to whether they are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores. • Complete a fact file about an animal of your choice.	<u>English - Write a letter to someone you know</u> • to say thank you for a Christmas present • to tell them about something you have been doing • to ask them about what they have been doing recently • to ask a question about something you want to know about • to ask their opinion about something	<u>Maths - Numbers to 20</u> Choose a number between 11 and 20. • How can you represent that number in different ways? • Which calculations can you write that make that number?	<u>Art - Cityscapes</u> Choose a building that you like the appearance of. It could be in real life or a picture of one. Draw or paint your version of the building.
<u>DT – Textiles</u> • Practise threading a needle and tying a knot in the end. • Can you join pieces of fabric together with some stitches? • If you are feeling adventurous, you could make a picture using and joining different pieces of fabric.	<u>History - The Great Fire of London</u> • Make a model of a house that may have existed at this time. • Make a collage of the Fire of London with the silhouette of London in the foreground.	<u>PSHCE – Keeping Myself Safe</u> • In PSHCE we will be talking about ways to keep ourselves safe in different situations • Talk with your grown-ups about ways that you can keep yourself safe at home. • Make a poster to highlight dangers in the home and how to keep yourself safe.	<u>Future Me – How to thread a needle</u> • There will be many situations when threading a needle for sewing will be needed and so this is an important life skill • Throughout school there will be different textiles projects where threading a needle for sewing will be needed. • Practice with different sized needles. • Can you sew on a button or sew up a hole in a sock?
