History Riotous Royals We will be learning about different Kings and Queens in British History. Can you choose one to research. Who were they? When did they reign? What are their greatest achievements? What do we remember then for? Perhaps you can visit a Historic Palace to find out more such as Buckingham Palace or Kensington Palace, The Tower of London or Hampton Court Palace?	English Spelling We will be sending home all of the children's updated spelling lists. These will include any spellings from the KS1 list they need to learn. You will already have received a copy of the LKS2 words with your child's report. Please practice learning a few of these words each week. We will sent home a sheet of ways that you could use to do this. At school we will continue to focus on learning spelling rules and applying these rules to our spelling.	Science Plants All of the children will be given a sunflower seed to plant at home. Please plant this in a pot and use what we have learned about plants to look after your sunflower as it germinates and starts to grow. We will bring the sunflowers back to school after half term to compare how they have grown, What conditions helped the sunflowers to grow? 
Maths Mass One of the units of work we will be covering next half term is Mass. This will include measuring in grams and kilograms. Use your kitchen or bathroom scales to compare the mass of different objects.
