Heart beaters Take your pulse rate at rest (counting how many pulses you have in 15 seconds and multiplying by four may be easier than taking your pulse for 60 seconds). Do star jumps for one minute and take your pulse rate afterwards. What has happened? Take your pulse rate every minute for five minutes after the star jumps — is it back to your resting rate yet?
