These activities are designed to give you ideas of activities to do at home with your families or independently, to support your learning at school. Please choose one per fortnight. We can't wait to see your creativity!

Geography

Biome in a box

Create a "Biome in a Box" to show a world biome such as a rainforest, desert or tundra. Use a shoebox or container to build the habitat with materials like paper, paint or recycled items. Include plants, animals, weather and land features. Add labels explaining the climate zone, temperature, rainfall and how living things adapt to survive. Include one fact about climate change and how it affects the biome. You may also add a map, moving parts or an information booklet. Be ready to present and explain your biome in class.

English

The Nothing to See Here Hotel

Can you now create your own exciting video advert for *The Nothing to See Here Hotel*? You may use iMovie or another video-making programme. Your advert should describe the hotel and persuade people to visit. Think carefully about the language you use to make the hotel sound fun, interesting and exciting. You could include special features, unusual guests or magical events from the story. Consider your background, props, music and sound effects. Try to speak clearly and confidently to engage your audience and make them want to book a stay!

Computing

Desktop Publishing

This half term in Computing we will be learning about desktop publishing. We will be learning how to combine text and pictures to create a design. We will explore how the size, colour and style of fonts can be changed for different purposes.

Can you create a poster using Desktop Publishing, related to something we are learning about at school or something you are particularly interested in at home? Perhaps it could be about a pet? A hobby you have or a place you like to visit?

PSHE

First Aid

This half term, we will be looking at what we should do if we find somebody needing first aid for example if they have bumped their head, have fallen over or are having an asthma attack. Maths

Fractions

Create your own set of Fraction Snap cards. These should include different representations of fractions such as halves, quarters, thirds, fifths etc... You could include real life images e.g. bar of chocolate, drawn images e.g. pizza, bar models, numerals or words. Make sure the same fraction is represented in different ways. Then bring your game in to share with your friends.

Science

Magnets

Create your own 3D magnetic maze using cardboard, straws and small objects. Put a paperclip on top and use a magnet underneath to guide it through the tunnels and obstacles.

Time yourself, make changes to improve your maze, and see how different magnets or distances change how well it works. Bring your maze into school so you can explore each other's!
