Site Introduction

The school covers a large rural catchment and is on two sites juniors and infants which are based in the villages of Gawcott and Tingewick. The school site at Gawcott was built in 1971 at the top of Church Street which is a dead end street. It adjoins only one residential property to the east-side with most of its perimeter surrounded by open fields. To the north and running west of the school is a public footpath and bridleway. The staff car park is at the front of the building. Relative to the rest of the village, it lays on the south central side. (Appendix: 2a)

Site Details

The Tingewick school was built in 1874 on Main Street in the village. The frontage has a public play area before the pavement and road; to the West a pub car park. On the other side of this car park is the Village Hall car park which is also the vehicular entrance to the school staff car park. The large school field at the back is bounded by private properties on all 3 sides. The school is situated in the middle of the village. (Appendix: 2b)

Both sites have a large catchment area which includes the following villages:

Gawcott, Buckingham, Preston Bissett, Hillesden, Barton Hartshorne, Tingewick, Chetwode, Westbury and Turweston. There is currently new housing being built in Gawcott (36 dwellings) and in Westbury (24 dwellings). By 2012/2013, with further new housing being planned, it is anticipated that the school will be over-subscribed.

The school continues to enlarge with Year 6 provision from 2010 in the Gawcott site and improvements to classrooms and other facilities at Tingewick.

Other Information

Roundwood is a Primary School within Bucks LEA funding control. It is based across 2 sites: Foundation and Key Stage 1 provision at Tingewick and Key Stage 2 at Gawcott.

Children are able to start school, in the Foundation Stage Class, the term after their 4th birthday and can stay at the school until they are 11, when they transfer either to The Royal Latin School, Buckingham or The Buckingham School.

There are currently 103 pupils on role in Gawcott and 75 on role in Tingewick.

There are 5 teachers, 4 classroom assistants, 4 lunchtime assistants, 2 Bursar/Admin officer and 1 caretaker/cleaner at Gawcott and 3 teachers, 5 classroom assistants, 4 lunchtime assistants, 1 admin officer and 1

caretaker/cleaner at Tingewick. One Head teacher moves between sites at all times of the school day. One Acting-Deputy is based on the both sites.

The school day at Tingewick lasts from 8.45am to 3.00pm. The school day at Gawcott is from 9.00am to 3.15pm. There is after school provision in the form of After-school clubs which occur on 4 days and run until 4.00-4:30pm. There is extended provision at the beginning of the day in the form of a Breakfast Club. This is held at the Tingewick site (7.30am to 8.45am). KS2 children who attend the breakfast club are transferred by minibus to the Gawcott site at 8.30am.

Roundwood has a minibus which allows pupils to change site for various purposes at different times of day depending on the activities, and is also used for local visits and trips.:

Visitors are able to park within the school staff car parks but sometimes they are full. The school is considering other alternatives but there is a serious lack of space at both sites. Pre-school staff use the school car park at Tingewick which is part of the overcrowding problem at that site and at Gawcott the car park can only accommodate 5 cars at most sensibly. This means that at both sites cars have to be left on the roadside.

In the last few years it has become clear that more children are being driven to school.

It is our intention that this School Travel Plan will assist in improving conditions so that all children will have the opportunity to travel to and from the school safely and to highlight and encourage the use of safer routes to school.

Unfortunately, current County travel policy has certain inequalities. At times, coaches with adult seat belts have been sent to pick up children as young as 5. Legally, they are able to do so. Morally and for safety reasons, we are greatly concerned. The working group are in negotiation with Amey transport, County and the bus company to address this matter.

Details of Walking Access to site

Children who live in the villages can walk to school. There are no pedestrian crossings in either villages. There is no path along Church Street which is the main road access to the Gawcott site. The majority of children therefore access the school via the path that runs adjacent to the church opposite.

Details of Cycling access to site

A few children cycle to school although this is increasing, and is more popular once the Year 5 have done their bikeability, and in the Summer. There are no specific cycle routes as such. Many parents will only allow the children to cycle if an adult can accompany them. There is no cycle path between Tingewick and Gawcott.

Details of Bus access to site

There are village buses but do not coincide with opening and closing times of school. Lots of changes of buses would be involved to travel to school. Many children use the county provided buses to travel to and from school. The local bus service (132) stops on Main Street but does go via Tingewick and Buckingham.

Details of Rail access to site

There are nearby train stations in Bicester 10 miles and Milton Keynes 12 miles. Both of these train stations have links to major cities such as London and Birmingham.

Details of Road Access to site

We have a nearby ring road and feeder road from it into the 2 villages. However, the roads through the two villages are narrowed due to parked cars on either side of the road. Lots of properties are cottages and do not have off-road parking. There is no path between the two villages. The roads are not of a good standard with lots of pot-holes and poor drainage.
